Story Hours: Story hours will continue through the week of July 19. Little Listeners for 3 to 5 years old without parents meets on Mondays from 10:00 – 10:30 a.m., Together Time for 24 to 36 months old with adult meets on Tuesdays from 10:00 – 10:30 a.m., Family Time for 2 to 5 years old with adult will meet on Tuesdays from 1:00 – 1:30 p.m. and Tiny Tot Time for 12 to 24 months old and adult will meet on Thursdays from 10:00 – 10:20 a.m. No advanced registration, but the library requests that the child is participating in the Summer Reading program.

Story Hour at Farm Park: The library will be offering a family story hour for 2 to 5 year olds with an adult at **Fon Du Lac Farm Park** on **Wednesdays from 10:30 to 11:00 a.m.** until July 21. Show your library card and get in for \$1.00 per person. Story hour will be cancelled if it is raining or there are storm warnings at the time. The Farm Park is located at 300 Newmann Drive, off of Meadows Ave.

Brown Bag It: Bring your lunch, join your friends and meet us in the meeting room on **Wednesdays at noon.** On **July 7** become Masters of Disasters with the American Red Cross and on **July 14** learn about animal scare tactics with Forest Park Nature Center. No advanced registration is required.

To be eligible to attend this party participants need to be registered for the summer reading program and must have read the required number of books for his/her age group. Registration with payment is required.

Story Hour sessions will begin on **September 13th** and will end on **November 18th** (10 weeks).

All story hour sessions are available on a drop-in basis. This means that there will be **no required advanced registration.** The library does request, however, that the parent/guardian has a valid library card and that the child be the appropriate age by the start of the story hour session.
