

HOOPLA DIGITAL AND MANGO LANGUAGES: FDL'S NEWEST SERVICES

Fondulac District Library is excited to announce that hoopla digital and Mango Languages are now available to cardholders.

Hoopla allows Fondulac District Library cardholders to instantly borrow movies, music, audiobooks, eBooks, comics, and TV shows to enjoy on a computer, tablet, phone, TV, or smart TV. Cardholders may check out up to 4 titles per calendar month. Titles can be streamed



To get started, download the hoopla digital app from the Apple, Google Play, or other app store. Computer users can click on the hoopla link at *fondulaclibrary.org*, or visit *hoopladigital.com*. Users will need to provide their Fondulac District Library card number and PIN when they create their account to borrow materials.



Mango Languages offers access to more than 70 foreign language courses and 17 English courses taught completely in the user's native language. In addition to traditional language courses, Mango also offers the opportunity to learn through foreign film with Mango Premiere and access to a variety of specialty mini courses, like Pirate, Medical Spanish, and romance courses. Mango can be accessed at the library, remotely at fondulaclibrary.org/research, or on-the-go with apps for iPhone, Android, Kindle, and Nook.

STUDY ROOM PROJECT

Fondulac District Library plans to undergo a minor interior redesign in the fall of 2018. The revision to the second floor will offer additional options for quiet and collaborative spaces for both individuals to work alone and for groups to work together.

Fondulac District Library currently offers two study rooms with capacity for four people each. Study room usage has continued to increase each year since the opening of the current library facility in 2013 and has increased 67 percent over the past four fiscal years. In fiscal year 2018, nearly 2,500 people utilized the rooms for studying, working, tutoring, and meeting formally and informally. Additionally, patrons frequently inquire about meeting space for small groups greater than the capacity offered by the current rooms.

The library plans to remain open during construction and will work to ensure services are as uninterrupted as possible. Study rooms will be available on a first come first served basis until construction begins. This redesign will be paid for entirely from the library's reserve fund.

REPORT ON THE STRATEGIC PLAN FOR FY2018

In April 2016, the library adopted a strategic plan for fiscal years 2017 to 2019 to provide leadership with focus for making decisions related to resource allocation and the achievement of the organization's vision. As a result of the planning process, the Board adopted the following goals for FY2018:

- Marketing: Empower the staff to market the library's resources
- · Services: Provide opportunities for patron collaboration and training
- Technology: Develop library apps for streamlined mobile access to library services and features

The library's communication of existing resources was enhanced by the launch of the twice monthly eNewsletter in September 2017. Additional marketing initiatives include *In the Loo(p)* at the Library, which provides programming highlights via signage in the library's bathroom stalls, and a stronger Facebook presence with increased event promotion.

New services and collaborations with the community included a partnership with the Peoria Riverfront Museum, which provides library cardholders the opportunity to visit the museum free of charge. Library programs, such as the Big Rig Petting Zoo, fostered relationships with several organizations and businesses, and the opening of the Reading Garden outside the library has provided more opportunities for creative programming and a place to relax.

The launch of a live chat feature on the library's website and a newly streamlined shoutbomb text messaging service provide immediate, cutting edge service to patrons. The library's addition of streaming services with hoopla digital and access to online foreign language learning with Mango provide additional modern resources for patrons.

The library's strategic plan calls for the library to continue its focus on these goals in FY2019 with the addition of expanding the library's outdoor programming, and library leadership and staff are looking forward to making further progress in these areas.
